Workshop Overview

During the three (3) hour seminar, the two following topics will be presented:

Anti-money Laundering (AML) Challenges

Over the past 3 years, the regulatory landscape has indicated that AML has become one of the most significant areas of concern and focus, across a number of industries, with emphasis on the financial services sector. To address AML concerns a new era for AML is evolving focusing on a risk-based approach. When applying a risk-based approach the aim is to identify and assess the risks faced by a Firm or an Institution and drive towards managing those risks effectively concentrating on higher risk areas.

- How does that conflict with the term being 'compliant' when it comes to the thousands rules and regulations applied by the Firms & Institutions in their effort of staying compliant and avoid possible penalties and sanctions by regulators?
- 'Are we' all ready to move away from 'ticking the box' regime to this new prescribed risk based approach?
- Are 'the regulators' ready to switch to this new era?
- What is the impact of the 4th Directive with regard to the aforementioned challenges?
- Does the 4th Directive provide solutions to these challenges or will it introduce even more hassle?

These are some of the questions to be covered in the workshop in addition to analyzing the impact of the 4th Anti-AML Directive and the future changes anticipated and the way Lawyers should deal with the consequences of the 4th Anti-AML Directive.

Discovery & Digital Forensics : Enhancing the traditional legal process

In a dispute, litigation or regulatory investigation, responding to a discovery request or regulator notice involves a myriad of complex requirements for proper data collection, processing, hosting, review and production. The number of responsive documents can range from very few, to hundreds (or even millions) and each responsive, non-privileged document must be produced in an efficient, secure, easily accessible manner. When lawyers take on clients and cases containing not only hard copy but more specifically, electronic media (Laptops, Disks, Servers, Mobile devices, etc.) and large amounts of data, they may not know where to turn for guidance.

Electronic Discovery practices are designed to manage small to large volumes of data during investigations - whether the data is already available in electronic format or in hard copy - as well as efficiently managing all technical aspects. Electronic Discovery & Digital Forensics practices include data collection, handling, retention and analysis of data with specific tools and methodologies in order to find information and evidence relevant to the investigation and to the legal case.
