When applying a risk-based approach the aim is to identify and assess the risks faced by a Firm or an Institution and drive towards managing those risks effectively concentrating on higher risk areas.

When lawyers take on clients and cases containing not only hard copy but more specifically, electronic media (Laptops, Disks, Servers, Mobile devices, etc.) and large amounts of data, they may not know where to turn for guidance.
